DON'T FORGET:


- ◆ **Flu vaccinations take place on Monday. If your child is unwell and in school then please make sure you notify the office staff.**

Prayer Space Day

On Tuesday the children had the opportunity to reflect and pray about Remembrance Day. The children made Remembrance bracelets, used balloons to lift their prayers, remembered those who had died and used chalk and blackboards to write 'SORRY' prayers. **Pine class**







Apple class—as part of our topic on Little Red Hen, we made bread rolls. We decided that we could show generosity by making a loaf of bread for Miss Miller and all the classes in school.



Pear class—for the generosity worship, Pear class talked about what generosity means to us in particular, such as sharing with siblings and giving to people in need. We then re-told the story 'Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand'.



Cherry class—we learnt about the Old Testament story of Elisha the Prophet (2Kings). A generous women built him a room on top of her house for him to stay in. We made our own rooms for Elisha.



Lime class thought about being generous to people they cannot see. They told us about giving donations and money to charity, giving to food banks and looking after our planet for future generations.



Beech class—we presented a generosity rap, we enjoyed learning the actions and rapping with rhythm.



Pine class —every time someone in our class showed generosity they were rewarded a generosity coin. We found out that we had so many things to be generous with: our time, friendship and our things.



Willow class reflected on all the discussions and assemblies that had taken place over the half term on the Christian value and thought about how they could, as individuals, be generous and how generosity is shown to them. Each member of the class recorded their thoughts on an autumn leaf which, when put together, formed part of the class R.E. and Worship reflection display



Sycamore class—prepared and song a melodious song, which we thoroughly enjoyed.
