# PREVENTING BULLYING

**Next week is Anti-Bullying week and we will be having our Take Away Theatre production. This is subsidised by the PTA, but a £1 donation would be welcome.**



**In PSHE (Personal Social Health Education) your child will learn that bullying *is*...**

- ...something which happens several times;
- ...is deliberate—the other person wants to upset, humiliate or harm the target.

**And that bullying *is not*...**

- \* ...a one-off fight or argument;
- \* ...thoughtless or insensitive comments.

#### Parents/Carers can:

Be a good role-model in the way you talk about and treat others—your child will learn that everybody deserves respect.

Model empathy for others—talk about how other people might feel in different situations: in real-life, TV programmes, books, films and plays.

Discuss that children have different needs and do not always understand how their behaviour affects others. For these children, it may be a lack of understanding, or low self-esteem that causes them to upset others.

**As a school we take bullying very seriously. We educate through PSHE and our Christian Values.**
