# PREVENTING BULLYING

As next week is Anti-Bullying week and last week we had our 'Just Joshing' production, we thought it would be useful to remind everyone of the following:

**Quick checklist: What bullying is (and isn't).**

In PSHE (personal, social, health education) your child will learn that bullying:

- goes on for a while, or happens regularly;
- is deliberate. The other person wants to hurt, humiliate or harm the target;
- involves someone (or several people) who are stronger in some way than the person being bullied. The person doing the bullying has more power, they are stronger, there are more of them or they have some 'hold' over the target (e.g. they know a secret about them).

**Because these three things have to happen together for something to be called 'bullying', they will learn that bullying is not:**

- \* a one-off fight or argument;
- \* a friend sometimes being nasty;
- \* an argument with a friend.

## Parents/Carers can:

Be a good role-model in the way you talk about and treat others—your child will learn that everybody deserves respect.

Model empathy for others—talk about how other people might feel in different situations: in real-life, TV programmes, books, films and play.

Discuss that children have different needs and do not always understand how their behaviour affects others. For these children, it is a lack of understanding, not bullying.
