
Dear Parents and Carers,

Saving Shenfield Library

Please note there are many petitions that seek to save Shenfield Library. Unfortunately, Essex County Council have claimed that many of these are invalid. There is currently **only one valid petition to save Shenfield library** (it has been through checks so it can be raised in the House of Commons). A paper copy of this petition is held at the following Shenfield shops and cafes:

Onaplate; Dickeson & Fone; Winslows; Shenfield Wine Company; Martins; Rose's Bakery; Woodys; A Gilmore & son greengrocer; Hutton Road Fisheries; Shenfield Bakery; Martins; Millets; Shoedoc dry cleaner; New Image; Clean shop; Sincerely Yours; Liquorice.

There is also a copy of this petition at the School's reception.

It can be signed by anyone who lives, works or studies within the administrative boundaries of Essex and is over 12 years old.

Alex Bughart has already raised possible closure of Shenfield Library in the House of Commons based on this petition. With your help, we would like to reach 4,000 signatures by the end of January and thereby influence some key meetings. Please consider signing this petition if you haven't already. All other petitions to save Shenfield library are invalid.
