Dear Parents and Carers,

WELCOME BACK! We hope you all had a lovely summer, and managed to have a break, even if your original travel plans had to change. It's great to see so many children in school again and ready for their new school year.

A warm welcome to our new children starting in Apple class, and also to our new staff members: Mrs Adams, Miss Clarke and Miss Claydon. Apple class have had a super settling in week and we look forward to seeing them full time next week.

Amendments to drop off and pick up notice. Thank you for your co-operation this week; the congestion has eased dramatically now parents are waiting on the green until it is their classes time to line up. Due to pavements being narrow at points around the school, we would like you to take serious note of the points below. After I have observed and reviewed drop off and pick up times this week, I would like to make some changes:

- Please **do not congregate** to chat in areas around the school before/after you drop off. This is causing our pupils and parents to have to walk into the road to get around you.
- Please ensure when you line up you are leaving a **2m gap** from the person in front of you.
- **Lime/ Cherry and Apple class.** At drop off, the school carpark gate will be open, please use this space if you are towards the end of the line.
- **Apple Class** please wait until all of Lime and Cherry class have gone in before you queue.
- **Willow Class** - from Monday, please drop off at the **Chuckles gate** (to alleviate congestion around Pear gate). Still collect at Pear gate for now.
- **Beech class** - from Monday, please drop off at the main entrance gate (not the side ramped gate) to ease congestion. Pick up from ramped gate, as normal.

Please note, our teachers have very little prep time and breaks at the moment during the day. They also have to be out of their classes promptly after the children have left so that each class can be deep cleaned. Therefore, if any children have not been picked up on time, they will need to be taken to the courtyard in front of the office, so that the teachers can get on with their prep for the following day. Please make every effort to pick up your child/children promptly.



Sweets for birthdays can be brought in if they are **individually wrapped**. We will give them to the children at the end of the day, so that the parents can choose when they want their child to eat it.

Please pray for Frances, our school crossing lady, who has sadly lost someone dear to her this week.




Curriculum Overview

Mrs Nott's Book Club

Unfortunately, we are not able to run school clubs this half term. However, during the partial school closure I was able to continue with my year 5 and 6 Book Club online, using ItsLearning, and I would like to do this again this term.

For the online club, pupils all read the same book and are set a section to read at home each week. I then put discussion questions on a forum on ItsLearning and pupils contribute their ideas and comments in writing online.

The aim of the club is to encourage higher level reading skills for keen readers and to introduce them to a variety of books that they might not choose to read themselves. As these are intended to stretch confident readers, they are books that would be labelled as 'S+' in the library and contain some more challenging themes.

Our first book this term will be "Bubble Boy" by Stewart Foster:

"Eleven-year-old Joe can't remember a life outside of his hospital room, with its beeping machines and view of London's rooftops. His condition means he's not allowed outside, not even for a moment, and his few visitors risk bringing life-threatening germs inside his 'bubble'. But then someone new enters his world and changes it for ever.


THE BUBBLE BOY is the story of how Joe spends his days, copes with his loneliness and frustrations, and looks - with superhero-style bravery, curiosity and hope - to a future without limits. Expect superheroes, super nurses and a few tears from this truly unique story."

Any pupils in **Years 5 or 6** who would like to be involved in Book Club this term should send me a message through ItsLearning or ask their parents to email me via the office email address. I have 6 copies of the book, which I can lend on a 'first come first' served basis. If more than 6 pupils wish to participate, they will have to either buy a copy of the book or borrow one from an online library.

I am also willing to set up a similar book club for Years 3 and 4 if there are pupils who would be interested in participating. I don't have sets of appropriate books for this age group, so parents would need to buy or borrow texts. If you have a child in one of these year groups who is keen to take part, please email me via the office address and I will organise something if there is enough interest.
