Monday 4th January - 12th February On Monday 4th January 2021, the Prime Minister announced a national lockdown in order to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

The new restrictions mean that our school will remain open only for the children of critical workers and vulnerable children to attend on site. All other pupils and students will receive remote education until February half term and must remain at home, in line with national guidance.

We need to ensure that the number of children accessing the offer of provision in school is kept to the **lowest number possible**. Therefore, even if you are a critical worker, if your child(ren) can remain at home rather than attend school, on some or all days, then they should. Please **only** use the offer of provision when it is **crucial for you to undertake your critical role**.

13 List making! Write a list of things that make you happy, things you're grateful for or things you are good at.

14 Design and make an obstacle course at home or in the garden. How fast can you complete it?

15 Can you invent something new? Perhaps a gadget or something to help people? Draw a picture or write a description.

16 Keep moving! Make up a dance routine to your favourite song.

17 Write a play script. Can you act it out to other people?

18 Read out loud to someone. Remember to read with expression.

19 Write a song or rap about your favourite subject.

20 Get sketching! Find a photograph or picture of a person, place or object and sketch it.

21 Junk modelling! Collect and recycle materials such as yoghurt pots, toilet rolls and boxes and see what you can create with them.

22 Draw a map of your local area and highlight interesting landmarks.

23 Write a postcard to your teacher. Can you tell them what you like most about their class?

24 Draw a view. Look out of your window and draw what you see.

25 Get reading! What would you most like to learn about? Can you find out more about it in books? Can you find a new hobby?

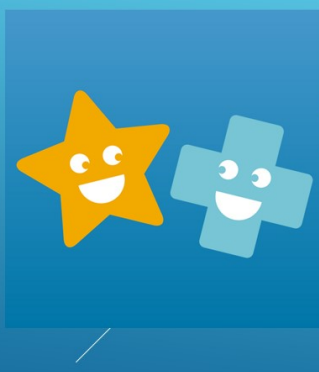

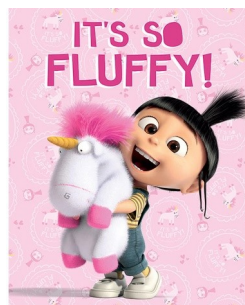
This is what some of our children have been up to this week:
