Monday 4th January - 12th February On Monday 4th January 2021, the Prime Minister announced a national lockdown in order to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

The new restrictions mean that our school will remain open only for the children of critical workers and vulnerable children to attend on site. All other pupils and students will receive remote education until February half term and must remain at home, in line with national quidance.

We need to ensure that the number of children accessing the offer of provision in school is kept to the lowest number possible. Well done Sophie!


