



Hutton All Saints' Primary School Sports' Premium Funding 2017-2018



In April 2013 the Government announced £150 million worth of school funding for Physical Education (PE) and sport as part of the 'Olympic Legacy'. It is intended that the funding be used to improve the quality of PE and sport provision in all state schools.

Hutton All Saints' School was allocated £8900 in 2015/16 and 2016/17, and £17,800 in 2017/18 which in accordance with the guidance, we will be channelling directly into developing the provision of sport and PE throughout the school.

The aims for the investment at Hutton All Saints' are:

- To increase the breadth and quality of the PE curriculum in all classes.
- To improve the teaching of PE beyond 2018.
- To increase participation of all children in physical activity and increase the profile of sport and Physical activity throughout the school.
- To increase the opportunities for pupils to compete in sports within school and between other schools.

In order to meet these aims, we will use the Sports' Premium Funding in 2017/18 to:

Employ a specialist sports coach, Mr Sims (Qualified KS3/4 specialist now coaching and supporting PE delivery in Primary Schools), to work across the school, team teaching P.E. lessons.

- Mr Sims supports the teaching and learning of pupils across the school. He will work on a half termly rotation so that all class based teachers work with him for 3 half terms throughout the year. Alongside this, Mr Sims will work with our PE leader to develop the curriculum and look into introducing a wider range of sports to the children.
- Mr Sims will also run a KS1 multi-skills club on Friday lunchtimes to develop core skills and engage our younger children in purposeful physical activity.

Essex Football Coaching to provide additional specialist sports coach to support Years 2 and 3 for half a day a week across a range of sports.

Impact: PE teaching and learning is improved across the school

Cost : £ 7050

Subsidise a range of extra-curriculum sports clubs.

- P.E. funding has been used to ensure the cost of P.E. clubs, which run outside the school day, are affordable for parents. This will continue this academic year.
- The range of clubs on offer has been significantly increased since the introduction of the Sports Premium, ensuring that more children are able to participate in PE outside of the school timetable.
- These subsidised clubs include: Y1 & 2 Football, Y3 & 4 Football, Y5 & 6 Football, Junior Girls' Football, Cheerleading,
- Enter competitions, tournaments and sporting events.
- Children will be able to attend district competitions such as netball, cross country and the district triathlon as well as events run by local secondary schools.
- The Sports' Premium money will pay for members of staff to be given time to organise and attend these events with a team of pupils.

Impact: The profile of PE is raised within the school and local community. More opportunities for enriched learning.

Cost : £2500

Teach PE lessons throughout the year in a larger indoor space.

- The local community centre will be hired out throughout the week in the afternoons. This allows children in Years 2- 6 to take part in PE lessons with more space. It also ensures that

longer, regular PE lessons can take place throughout the year. The school hall is then used predominantly for PE lessons in the morning and by EYFS and junior classes.

Intended Impact: PE teaching and learning is improved across the school.

Cost: £1500

PE Co-ordinator cover:

- Organise and accompany children to sporting events,
- organise and manage PE budget,
- Liaison with coaching teams,
- Team teaching with school staff to increase confidence and the quality of provision.
- Observing teaching and coaching from outside agencies
- Supply costs for activities in curriculum time.
- Manage staff CPD
- Monitor participation and organise clubs
- Organise District Sports event for all Middle school in the area
- Liaise with secondary local secondary schools so we can attend more sporting events organised by them

Intended Impact: PE teaching and learning is improved across the school.

**Pupils are able to take place in more competitive events and 'taster' sessions
P.E. is well lead and managed**

Cost: £4500

Buy new equipment for PE lessons, clubs and events such as sports day.

Including: football goals, balls, high jump crash mat, Gymnastic mats, kit for school teams (Basketball, football and Netball)

Intended impact: PE provision is improved across the school

Cost: £2000

The impact of this funding will be measured through:

- Direct feedback by teachers on the quality of support offered by specialist teachers in school.
- Lesson observations and climate walks to measure the effectiveness of the teaching of PE.
- The increase in the number of children engaging in school sporting activities either at after schools clubs or outside school.
- The increase in the number of children participating in inter-school competitions.
- The increase in the number of children who have responsibility for sporting events taking place in school, e.g. play-leaders, team captains, PE monitors etc.

Sports' Premium Funding 2017-2018

Expenditure

- **£240.00**

Paid to Champions' Academy Basketball for use of Beckett Keys for League games and Play-offs (2016/17 season and 2017/18 season).

- **£4,000**

Paid for PE coordinator release time to attend events and manage PE throughout the school.

Impact: The school has attended over 20 sporting events this year, allowing over 300 children to take part in inter-school competition.

The PE budget has been managed to allow the school to replace old equipment and purchase new kit for sporting events.

Time has been used to liaise with sports clubs and coaching companies to provide greater opportunities for HAS pupils.

- £680.00

Paid to Shenfield High School and Brentwood District School Sport Association

Impact: This expenditure allows us to enter the School Sport Partnership (SSP) events and access support from a specialist teacher at Shenfield High School (£300 has been paid in advance for next year's membership). It has also enabled us to take part in the Brentwood Schools' Athletic competition.

£55 of this enabled a staff member to gain an NGB qualification in swimming, meaning that they can now lead swimming lessons for our pupils.

- £4060.50

Subsidised extra curriculum PE clubs with specialist coaches – football, cheerleading, girls' football and dodgeball.

Impact: The profile of PE and sport continues to increase across the school with 553 places being taken up at extra- curricular clubs throughout the year.

- £4350.00

Specialist Coach (Foundation Sports up to December and PE4Primary from February to present) employed to work 1 day a week to support teaching and learning in all year groups.

Impact: Teachers continue to report greater confidence in teaching PE. Feedback from current coach (Mr Sims - Former Asst. Head of Secondary PE) shows high levels of competence and skill in all lessons delivered. All PE is at least 'good' with some 'outstanding'. Current coach has also assisted in developing the PE timetable for the next academic year to include a greater selection of sports for the children to access.

- £1224.00

Local Community Centre was hired out to provide a large indoor space for PE lessons.

Impact: The provision of PE lessons increases across the school.

- £1885.00

Spent on acquiring new kit and equipment.

Impact: New kits purchased so that school teams participated in inter-school competition wearing kits that fitted them. Equipment replaced as part of a rolling programme to ensure our pupils' safety and ability to access learning.

Results from 2017-18

- School was awarded a Gold Sainsbury's Award for the number of children participating in extra curriculum clubs, the number of sporting events attended and the participation of children leading and being involved in sporting events. This is the fourth year in succession!
- 17 sporting clubs were available across the school throughout the year including: table tennis, netball, football, girls' football, hockey, multi-skills, athletics, basketball and cheerleading, yoga, dance, Netball, Boxercise, Dodgeball. Over the course of the year over 553 children attended extra- curricular sports clubs, an increase of 132 on last year meaning on average every child attended 2.36 clubs within the year.
- The school entered into 28 inter-schools matches, competitions and tournaments despite losing the best part of 2 months to poor weather.

- Links with local sports clubs such as Winger Dodgeball Academy and Kazen Kai Martial Arts were made stronger with displays in assemblies.
- The school continued links with the local community by using the community centre for PE lessons.
- The school successfully hosted the District Sports' Athletics Competition for all middle schools in the area, finishing 1st overall.
- A successful sports day was held which involved all staff in the school. Year 6 were 'team leaders' for mixed age teams.
- Play Leaders was run with great success by the Year sixes with the support of Mrs Bennett and Mrs Sewell. Children in Key Stage 1 were able to participate with structured PE activities during lunchtime.
- By the end of the summer term, 60% of teaching staff had been supported in teaching gymnastics and athletics by Mr Sims with all being considered as 'Good' or 'Outstanding'. A change in timetabling will allow ALL teachers to work with Mr Sims next year.
- Children across the school showed enthusiasm and enjoyment for a variety of sports and gained life-long skills.
- In June we attended the 'Inclusive Festival' which allowed children with SEND to represent the school and access a variety of sports in a 'non-competitive' environment.
- One member of staff has successfully completed a NGB qualification in swimming and can now teach groups of children for swimming lessons.
- The school now actively promotes the daily mile with ALL pupils participating. Classes are being challenged to see how far they can run. Individual performance is being monitored in terms of improvement and links to academic development.

Expenditure

- **£2510.00**
Subsidised extra curriculum PE clubs with specialist coaches – football, cheerleading, table tennis, girls' football, hockey, tag rugby & athletics.
Impact: The profile of PE and sport continues to increase across the school.
- **£4710.00**
Specialist Coach (Foundation Sports) employed to work 1 day a week to support teaching and learning in all year groups.
Impact: Teachers report greater confidence in the delivery of PE lessons. All lessons observed by Head Teacher and P.E. Co-ordinator to be good or outstanding.
- **£1500.00**
Local Community Centre was hired out to provide a large indoor space for PE lessons.
Impact: The provision of PE lessons increases across the school.
- **£623.57**
New equipment bought for PE Lessons, clubs and school based events including; balls, sand pit refurbishment, Swimming hats and table tennis equipment.
Impact: PE profile is raised within the school community

Results from 2016-17

- School was awarded a Gold Sainsbury's Award for the number of children participating in extra curriculum clubs, the number of sporting events attended and the participation of children leading and being involved in sporting events.
- Healthy schools award achieved
- 17 sporting clubs were available across the school throughout the year including: table tennis, netball, football, girls' football, hockey, multi-skills, athletics, basketball and cheerleading, tag

rugby, dance, Netball, Body Boost, Dodgeball. Over the course of the year over 420 children attended extra- curricular sports clubs, meaning on average every child attended 2 clubs within the year.

- The school entered into 28 inter-schools matches, competitions and tournaments.
- Links with local sports clubs such as Warwick Cheerleading and Kazen Kai Martial Arts were made stronger with displays in assemblies and at Sports Day.
- The school continued links with the local community by using the community centre for PE lessons.
- The school successfully hosted the District Sports' Athletics Competition for all middle schools in the area, finishing 2nd overall.
- A successful sports day was held which involved all staff in the school. Year 6 were 'team leaders' for mixed age teams.
- Play Leaders was run with great success by the Year sixes with the support of Mrs Bennett, Mrs Sewell and Mr Oaks. Children in Key Stage 1 were able to participate with structured PE activities during lunchtime.
- At the end of the Summer Term, all teaching staff were observed teaching PE by the Head Teacher and P.E. co-ordinator. 100% of lessons were judged to be 'Good' or 'Outstanding'.
- Children across the school showed enthusiasm and enjoyment for a variety of sports and gained life-long skills.
- In June we attended the 'Inclusive Festival' which allowed children with SEND to represent the school and access a variety of sports in a 'non-competitive' environment.

PE teaching and learning improved across the school.**
- £4680.00
Specialist coaches team-taught PE lessons throughout the year in all year groups. These include: basketball coach working with Year 3, a cricket coach working in Year 4, a dodgeball coach working with Year 6 and Foundation Sports delivering lessons throughout the year to KS1, Year 5 and Year 6.
Impact: PE teaching and learning improved across the school.
- £968.75
Local community centre is hired out for a larger indoor area to teach PE effectively.
Impact: PE teaching and learning improved across the school.
- £777.13
Expenses for taking teams to matches which take place during the school day, e.g. events at local secondary schools, county basketball tournament, etc.
Impact: The profile of PE raised within the school and local community.

- 17 sporting clubs were available across the school throughout the year including: table tennis, netball, football, girls' football, hockey, multi-skills, athletics, basketball and cheerleading, tag rugby and dance.

- The Year 4 Basketball team won the Champions Academy League (competing against local schools).
- The Year 6 Basketball team won the Champions Academy League and the Essex Winter Games (competing against the best schools from all districts in the county). This featured in the local press as well as individual achievements of pupils who played for East of England.
- A sports newsletter was created to celebrate the achievements in sport in and out of school.
- The school continued links with the local community by using the community centre for PE lessons.
