Dear Parents/Carers and Pupils,

As you will have seen in the news this week, the government has now changed its proposals to bring back all primary children before the end of term. We would absolutely love to have all our children back in school, but while government guidelines about 2 metre distancing and maximum bubble sizes remain in place, we unfortunately don't have the capacity to offer places to any additional year groups, due to staffing and space limitations at this time.

We will continue to monitor the situation closely, and will keep you informed of any changes. If the children remain unable to attend for the remainder of this term, we will think about what we can offer those not in school - even if it's just a chance to say bye to their current teachers via a zoom catch up, for example.

At the moment, we are assuming full capacity to resume from 2nd September 2020, although we would need current guidelines to change in order to facilitate this. Again, we will keep you updated throughout if we receive any revisions to the guidelines.

The choices for next week will be **ham, cheese or tuna** sandwiches, with fruit, vegetable sticks and a yoghurt/treat depending on the day.






Here are Anay, Priya and Stanley demonstrating a fun, but simple science experiment to try at home.

Many of you will be aware that Hutton Parish is helping to lead the work in providing groceries and support for those affected the most by the Coronavirus outbreak. The fantastic team work incredibly hard and have mobilised an enormous team of volunteers to collect, pack, and distribute food parcels from their church building and into the surrounding communities. Their "normal" week sees them open up every morning (apart from Sundays) to give away and deliver over 360 bags of food. The bags of food are **completely free**, so if you know of anyone who might benefit, please do tell them to go to St Peter's any morning between 10am-12pm.

The team would also like to reduce the amount of fresh food wasted each day, so if you're in need of any fruit, bread or vegetables, why not pop down to the church and see what they have that day? You are welcome to take food for free, or to make a contactless contribution if you would prefer to do so.
