In the kitchen: Eva, Luke and Zac have been baking yummy treats, and Louise and William have been making... SLIME!

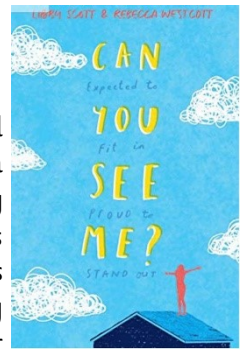

BOOK CLUB: Book Recommendation from Mrs Nott

Can You See Me? *By Libby Scott and Rebecca Westcott*

This is the story of Tally, an 11 year old girl with Autistic Spectrum Condition and Pathological Demand Avoidance. The book follows her as she navigates her way through the transition from primary to secondary school. It shows her frustration at being misunderstood, while also focusing on the feelings and challenges of the family and friends who try to support her. However, Tally's autism can also be a superpower, and the book has a heart-warming and uplifting ending. Rebecca Westcott is a British author and primary school teacher and she collaborated on the book with Libby Scott, a young autistic writer and autism advocate. I have recently finished reading this book, and can't recommend it highly enough! It has really made me rethink everything I thought I knew about autism. It would be a great book for pupils in years 5 or 6, but I would also urge adults to read it too! If you read this book, I hope you love it as much as I do! Science corner



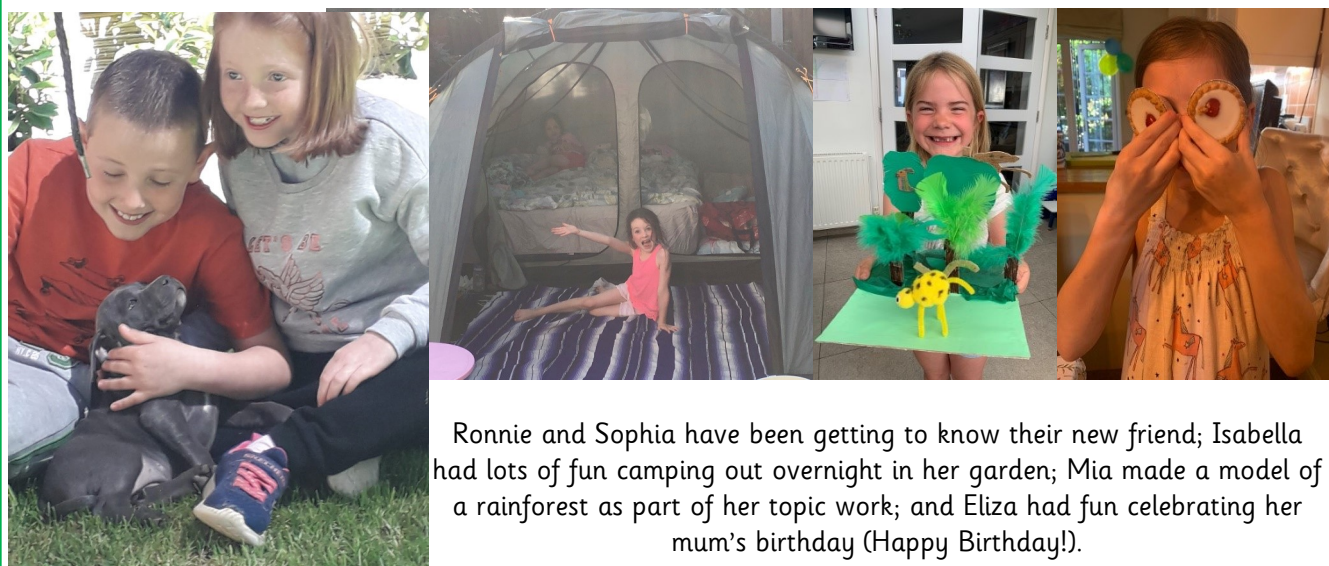
Henry and Beckett doing a lava lamp experiment in their garden.

Infants using microscopes in a biology lesson about cells.





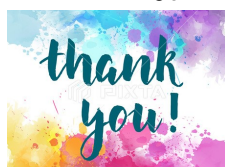
