In Maths we will be looking at:

Place value (within 10), addition and subtraction (within 10) and shape.

In Science, for the first half term, we will be learning about everyday materials and their properties. In the second half term, we will be learning about seasonal changes in Autumn and Winter.

The children will be continuing to learn to read and write using the 'Read Write Inc' phonics scheme, moving through the colour groups. In addition to this they will have separate English lessons focussed on reading and writing, where we will continue to improve our handwriting, reading comprehension, grammar and punctuation skills.

Please help support the reading by ensuring your child has at least 4 reading opportunities with an adult each week; recording the title and date in the diary as evidence. We will check this progress regularly.

Throughout our Topics, 'The Gunpowder Plot' and 'The Great Fire of London', the children will be exploring events from a period in British History, through the use of appropriate questions and vocabulary.

In DT, we will be exploring textiles by using a running stitch to join fabrics and decorate them.



Pear Class Autumn Term 2023

We will develop our understanding of technology and how it can help us in our everyday lives. We will start to become familiar with the different components of a computer by developing keyboard and mouse skills. We will also consider how to use technology responsibly. Later in the term, we will experiment with tools used for digital painting/photography.

During the first half term, we will be exploring the topic of 'Senses', exploring music using our voices and classroom instruments and developing our understanding of dynamics, duration, timbre, tempo, pitch and rhythm. After half term, we will create music linked to the 'Great Fire of London', using both Western and graphic notation and interpreting dynamic symbols. Through listening, we will begin to develop our knowledge and understanding of baroque music.

On Tuesdays, children will learn and improve their Gymnastic skills.

On Wednesdays, children will be developing their fundamental and ball skills.

Our values this term are Creativity and Peace.

In RE, for the first half term, we will be exploring the question 'Who made the world?'. In the second half term, we will be discussing the question, 'What do religious people say God is like?'.







- Reading is a key focus in Year 1, and your child's reading skills are developed through a combination of daily phonics sessions and reading time with adults in school.
- Complete reading records so we can see what the children have been doing at home. Read at least 3 times a week at home.
- Introduce your child to a variety of genres, such as poetry, newspapers, fiction, non-fiction, etc.
- Talk about what you have read ask your child questions: retrieval, inference, opinion.
- >Oxford Owl online free e-books at their own RWI level.

- > Reading books are changed every Friday in your child's Read Write Inc group.
- ➤ **Read Write Inc** books will be largely phonetically decodable books which the children have read and explored during the week. They read at home to practise fluency and expression.
- ➤ Read Write Inc Book Bag Books give extra practice of the sounds they have been learning in their group.
- Library books it's really important that they have access to higher level books to support love of books and to aid with inference and vocabulary skills. These are for sharing at home.








- As writing is linked to speech, please engage your child in conversation, encouraging them to speak clearly and effectively, in simple sentences.
- > Model correct pronunciation back to them.
- Practise handwriting on the lines, keeping letters proportionate in size and with finger spaces.
- ➤ Correct pencil grip.
- Ensure letters are formed correctly using correct handwriting style.

>Help model the difference between capitals and lowercase letters, and when to use

them.









- >Label clothing.


- Children in Year 1 throughout the country will all be taking part in a phonics screening check during the same week in June.
