After half term, Sycamore and Willow classes began a course of Outdoor Education with Mr. Howard. The children will learn lots of problem-solving skills and teamwork skills that will be extremely useful in all areas of their lives.

Fortunately, the weather has stayed mostly dry (though we would have carried on in the rain), and everyone has had lots of fun.

Sycamore Class are learning how to read maps and navigate with accuracy, whilst Willow Class have constructed an 'aerial gutter' and tried to run a golf ball down it as quickly as they could.
