


Who's that behind the mask?



Here's Sonny with a banana and strawberry loaf cake that he made. He got a baking subscription for Christmas and gets a different bake in the post every month. It looks delicious!



Eva and Noah cycled to the Butterfly Meadow for a game of hide and seek. Noah also made chocolate cornflake crispie cakes all on his own - yum!!



Arthur and Stanley made this brilliant bug house - they'll have to let us know which insects come and visit!
