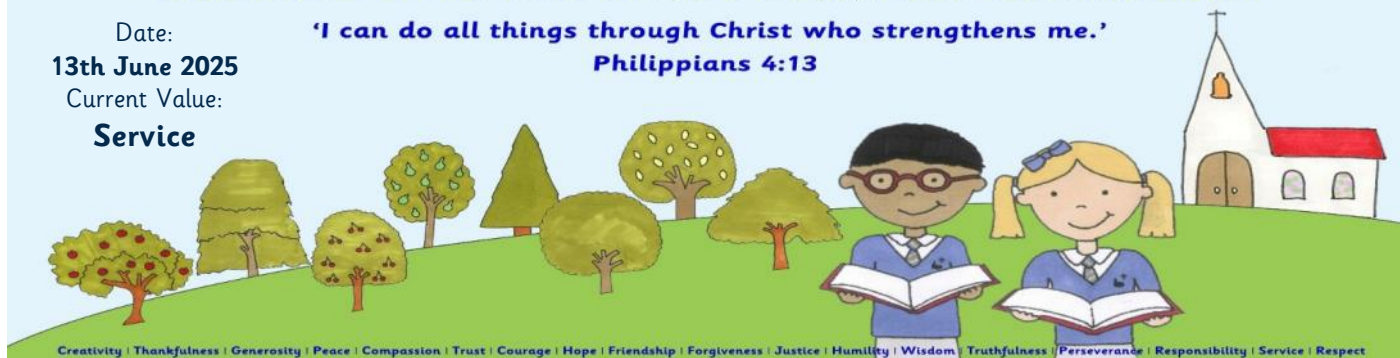

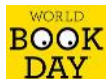

Logan (Lime) was voted Player's Player for the season. Oliver (Lime) was awarded Manager's Player of the season as well as Captaincy for their football team

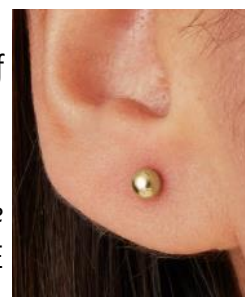


Earrings

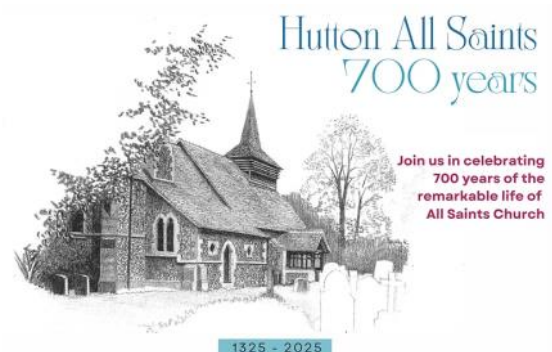
