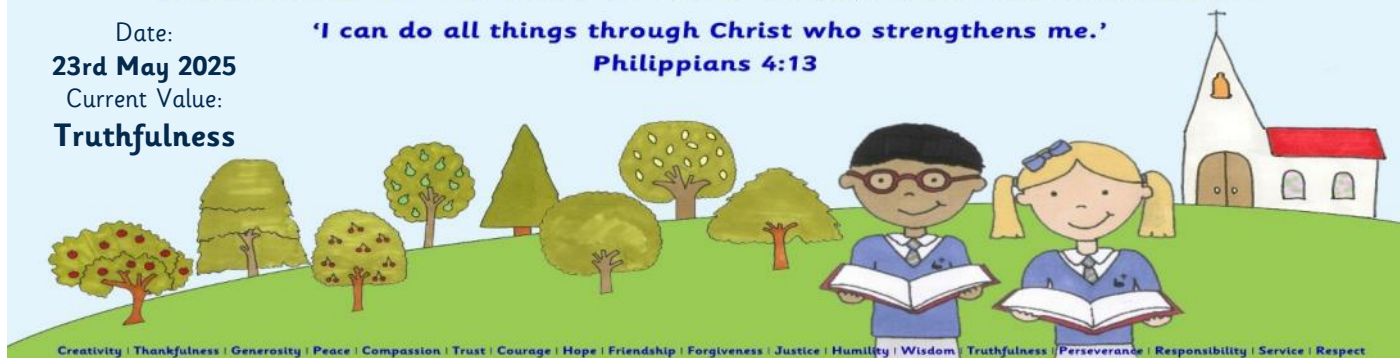

Value Worship

On Thursday, each class shared with the rest of the school what they had learnt about the current school value, truthfulness. Apple- read a prayer and acted out a Bible story; Pear- read a poem about honesty; Lime- sang a song and played musical instruments; Beech- acted out a play- The Boy Who Cried Wolf; Pine- discussed when they had told the truth and made a truth tree to remind us to be honest; Willow -educated everyone about how telling lies can escalate and when one told after another it is then hard to go back; Sycamore- acted out scenarios on telling the truth and asked our opinions on how we could solve the issues. .

A pupil from each class was chosen to receive a Value Leaf- giving reasons why they had particularly been acknowledged for the value of truthfulness. Well done Luke, Saydie, Freya, Shammah, Brandon, Penelope and Ava.



The Music Concert

A variety of performances showcasing voices, guitar, piano, cello and even electric drums. Well done everyone for performing in this lovely music event.



Year 5 British Museum

On Monday, Year 5 visited the British Museum to look at their Greek artefacts. They looked at items which spanned the Greek dynasty, starting with the Minoans in 3200BC (meaning some of the things viewed were nearly 5000 years old!). The children enjoyed looking at examples of jewellery, pots and statues, which helped them to understand how the Greeks lived all those years ago. The class discovered how the Parthenon, in Athens, was built and how its use has changed over the centuries, as various empires have invaded and then been invaded themselves. The children learned that many of the statues they saw no longer had heads. This was mainly because the necks of the statues are weak so the heads fell off over time, but also because the Ottoman Empire used the Parthenon to store gun powder, which exploded!

In the afternoon, the class continued using their detective skills to investigate the uses of Greek items in a handling session. The children asked questions about the materials used and their uses, and examined some pictures to help us understand. They then had to create a freeze frame, showing their items in use.

The children all learned so much and were also able to use the knowledge they have gained in class to have a very successful day. Their behaviour was, as always, immaculate. There are now even more questions which they want answers to, and we'll look into them after half term.

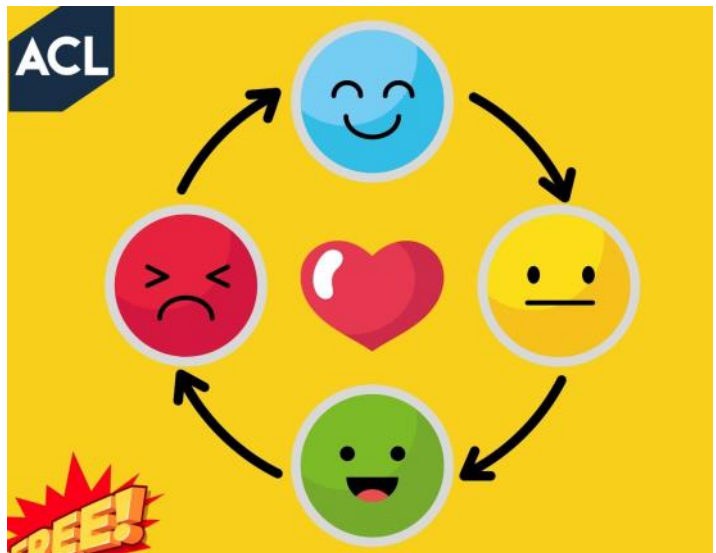
