

We loved hearing you read this charming story that has enchanted children for over 50 years!


Reading an extract of **"Charlie and the Chocolate Factory"** also by Roald Dahl was Mrs Ashton.

It was fun hearing about this hairy beast with a ridiculously large appetite, and his loyal friend with a clever plan!


Reading **"Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix"** by J. K. Rowling was Mrs Baptiste.




